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Where The Mersey Flows A

River Mersey

The Mersey Estuary continues through the 'Narrows' a straight narrow channel with depths of up to 30 m driven by a change in geology It forms the Outer Estuary, a large area of inter-tidal sand and mud banks as it flows into Liverpool Bay on the Irish Sea The Mersey is a tidal river with the second highest tidal range in the UK of about 10 m

Tame The River Mersey originates in Stockport, where the Goyt and Tame converge at an altitude of 40m AOD From Stockport the river flows in a westerly direction and is initially confined in a walled channel as far as Heaton Mersey, where the river begins to meander across the flood plain
